RE-INTERVENTION IN THE AESTHETIC ZONE : MANAGING ESTHETIC FAILURES

With the exponential rise in implant placements, re-intervention has evolved from a rare occurrence to a routine clinical challenge.

Mechanical complications, biological failures (such as mucositis and peri-implantitis), and patient dissatisfaction—whether functional or aesthetic—are now common indications for prosthetic revision.

In certain cases, the three-dimensional mispositioning of the implant may even necessitate its removal.

This lecture will explore the clinical decision-making process when facing a failing or compromised restoration in the aesthetic zone.
